Food for Thought

At a recent Principal's conference, I listened to a presentation on seven shifts that have occurred in the last forty years. The presenter spoke about truth moving from being seen as a notion of right, or wrong, to being relative. In the past people expected life to have a few ups and downs while the current generation think that life should be all easy.

Careers that once were linear and predictable are now a mosaic of opportunities and experiences. Written communication has moved from correct grammar, punctuation and spelling to a pure focus on function. (i.e; texting).

Learning was once seen as important in itself, whereas now it is based entirely on its usefulness. Respect used to be demanded and expected where now it must be earned. Lastly, the notion of risk was once seen as part of life where now if an accident happens it is seen as someone's fault. The implications of these shifts in our schooling system are both subtle and profound.

Teaching generation"Z" means that we are preparing them for jobs that do not exist, in a world that will be very different, against a backdrop of changing values and ideas.

Thank goodness, basic skills such as reading, writing, mathematics and thinking are always relevant.

Regardless of what the world throws up, Thornton students will be well prepared to meet it head on.


