Nutrition Snippet Foam Box Veggie Gardens



This spring all you need to start growing your own vegetable garden is a foam box! Foam boxes are light and easy for you and your kids to manage.

Step One: Cut six drainage holes in the bottom of the foam box.

Step Two: Elevate foam box by placing it on some old bricks and fill with potting mix.

Step Three: Plant seedlings or seeds, making sure not to over plant (aim to plant around 4-6 seedlings per box).

Step Four: Water and care for your seedlings daily.



Try planting tomato, pumpkin and zucchini seedlings this spring.
