With our Manager Cassandra Lantry on parental leave, I have the chance to say hello and pass on my congratulations to everyone involved with the different programs at Thornton Public School. I was fortunate enough to represent Barclay Property at the school's presentation day this week and it was a genuine pleasure. I found the entire event terrific and there were many highlights for me including the performances of the Rock Ensemble and the Tuition Group, as well as both the junior and senior Dance Ensembles. Equally impressive was the school choir led by the Principal Mr Millburn. I had the privilege of firstly receiving the Certificate of Appreciation presented to Barclay Property for becoming a partner of the school and supporting the Rock Ensemble and then in turn presenting the Music Award to Tegan Douglas, one of the young members of the group. After also hearing of the various academic and sporting achievements as well as reading about all the events and activities in which the school is involved, I can understand why there is so much enthusiasm here about being a partner of the school. Again congratulations to the students, Mr Millburn and staff and parents, you must all be very proud of your school.

As we are near the end of the year I thought I would pass on some information on property sales in Thornton during 2013. You might be interested in knowing that there have been around 120 properties sold so far this year and that the median price has been \$346,785. For the month of November there were 19 sold and the selling price of a four bedroom home ranged from \$479,000 to \$495,000 (figures taken from EAC and realestate.com.au). This year the market in general has been fairly unpredictable. Since the First Home Buyers Grant was removed for pre-existing homes the first home buyers in this region have tended to look to the new developments, while the great majority of other buyers have been existing home owners either down-sizing or up-sizing. Just recently we have seen more activity from investors who had pretty much been out of the market for the past 12 months. I would say there is guarded optimism about how things will be in the first part of 2014. On that note I pass on from all of us at Barclay Property, best wishes to you and your family for Christmas and the New Year.
