## **Student Reports Reflect Student Achievement**

Semester two reports are currently being written by all teachers. The reports are based on thorough assessment and grade based discussion. The reports use the grades *Outstanding, High, Sound, Basic and Limited*. These grades reflect standards which have consistency across the school, the area and even the state.

Students who are working well and demonstrating an adequate knowledge of the expected outcomes, will receive a *Sound*.

For students working at a high level of commitment, who demonstrate a thorough knowledge of the outcomes, the grade of *High* would be appropriate.

Outstanding effort and competence, with an ability to demonstrate the required skills in new situations, would be eligible for an *Outstanding*.

For those students who show a basic level of competence and understanding, the grade of *Basic* will apply.

For students who demonstrate an elementary level of understanding, the grade of *Limited* would be given.

In each case, the grade reflects the child's performance at that point of time. Students may move up and down the grades over a number of years depending on how they perform at each point of time. As is always the case, if there any questions, please see your child's teacher.
