Two Trenches One Letter

Twenty two Stage 3 students from Thornton have been selected to participate in a project called Two Trenches One Letter. The aim of the project is to promote the ANZAC spirit that exists between this new generation of Turkish and Australian students. Thornton Public School is the only school in Australia currently participating in this project.

This semester students from Thornton Public School replied to letters written by the Turkish students of Mersin College in Turkey. The letters from all the students are both gracious and heartfelt in expressing their feelings about ANZAC Day and its legacy to both countries.

This Tuesday the next step of the project will take place with the students meeting each other for the first time and sharing their letters via a skype link.

Congratulations to those students, who on Tuesday will not only represent Thornton Public School but be ambassadors for Australian youth.

Dear Ali Eren Altioglu, child of Mustafa Kemal Ataturk

My name is Lachlan Scott and I am 12 years old. I am proud to be a student at Thornton Public School which is in New South Wales on the east coast of Australia. This year Australia is commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the landing of Australian soldiers at Gallipoli.

In Australia we commemorate ANZAC Day on April 25 every year. On ANZAC Day we have Dawn Services to commemorate the soldiers who died on the battlefield. Dawn Services start at 5.30am and finish around 7.00am. We also have marches where old soldiers and lots of other people march and people all over Australia watch. At school this year we commemorated an event held a 100 years ago called Australia Day. We had a march and after the march we played the same games that children played in 1915. We also dressed up in clothes like people wore in 1915. In the parade I was honoured to carry the Turkish flag, your flag as a sign that we are now at peace.

One of the soldiers from our area that died at Gallipoli was Trooper Peter Zeisser. Peter Zeisser was born in Ultimo in Sydney in January 1894. He was the sixth of eight children and he loved his footy (football). Peter Zeisser enlisted in the army when he was 19 years and 8 months old. When Peter enlisted he was working as a farm labourer around Raymond Terrace. Peter liked his job he did a lot of hard work like mending fences, digging out tree stumps and looking after cattle. Peter was 165cm tall and weighed 63.5kg. He had a dark complexion, brown eyes and black hair. Peter was part of the 1st Light Horse Regiment. He departed Australia on October 20 1914. Peter was killed in action on August 7 1915 at the age of 20 years 7 months. Peter died when the officer blew his whistle and everyone got up out of the trench and started yelling and screaming ready to fight the Turks. He got shot and fell back into the trench dead.

Personally I think war is one of the worst things anyone could experience and I hope that there will be peace in the world and no more wars
