To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. But that was many years ago. Now children want new and snazzier toys and Clink is left all alone sitting on a shelf and gathering dust. 1/2T have completed some wonderful pieces of writing on Clink such as writing a letter to the shopkeeper to persuade him that Clink is an amazing robot. They have also written their own narratives with Clink going on a spectacular adventure and have produced some very creative artworks to match their writing!











KI have been learning all about patterns in maths. We know how to continue patterns and create our own patterns using different materials. We love working in groups on different activities.













This week our students contributed to National Recycling Week by bringing limited rubbish for their lunch and afternoon tea. They weighed the amount of rubbish they collected over the week. This was a great exercise to educate students how much collective rubbish can be produced. Australians produced 64 million tonnes, or 2.7 tonnes per person of waste in 2014-15, according to the National Waste Report. Most of this rubbish goes to landfill and could be recycled or composted. At Thornton we are making an effort to become more environmentally conscious by recycling or composting our waste, bringing in reusable containers and using less plastic in our lunch boxes.





Last Friday students were handed overdue notices for outstanding library books. As we are nearing the end of term please return these items as soon as possible. Week 7 will be the last week of borrowing for our students.

We have some great readers in our school. This year we have had over 20,000 books borrowed by our students. We also have 360 students receiving the Premiers Reading Challenge Certificate with 40 students receiving a Gold Certificate.

Please look after our books. We have some great resources in our school which are unfortunately not always looked after. This week I've had several near new books handed back to me damaged. We discuss with students how to care for our books. Please reinforce this at home.
