




#### Happy Halloween!





## 1/25



#### **Solar Car Challenge**


Stage 3 students competed recently at the Hunter Valley Electric Vehicle Festival.

Four teams entered the competition and were responsible for researching, designing, constructing and racing a mini electric vehicle.

All teams competed in both the sprint and pursuit categories. The sprint involved two cars racing on a straight track for 20m, while the pursuit involves two cars starting at opposite sides of an oval track and racing until one car chases down the other.

All teams competed strongly in the sprint category and after an electrifying grand-final (that required several re-runs and a video finish) the TPS Sparks finished 1st!

The pursuit was a technical challenge with the cars requiring speed and control to move around an oval track. Again all teams raced well with TPS Sparks finishing in 3rd place.
