Working Together Makes the Difference

Parent Teacher Interviews are planned for the coming weeks. Being able to talk about your child's progress in literacy, numeracy, social relationships and general work habits is a powerful way of monitoring and supporting your child's learning. Discussing what your child can do well and where your child may need to improve sets the scene for a successful year. It is also interesting for parents to get a bird's eye view of their child's social interaction style. Getting a feel for their social skills and work habits really paints the whole picture of your child.

Each child has set an academic goal, such as *"To improve my ability in addition and subtraction"* and a social goal such as *"To develop more friends and make the dance group"*.

The intention is for students to take responsibility for their learning, to reflect on their learning and for the goals to be reported on through the year.

Research suggests that effective communication between a parent and teacher can make a big difference to a child's learning. Students taking responsibility for their learning is also a powerful force in developing citizens for the 21st century.

Online Payment is here and ready to use!

From Monday 23rd March, Parents will be able to make online payments for anything normally paid at the school office. It is accessed via our school website by selecting the - **\$Make A Payment** button on the top right corner of the home page. It is a secure online payment facility hosted by Westpac Bank, using Visa or Mastercard Debit/Credit cards.

When you access the **\$Make A Payment** you must enter:

- **Payment Details** – Enter the student's name and date of birth and all other fields.

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system. No student's details are given to Westpac. As a consequence, payments for each child need to be made separately. (There is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice Number but these fields are not relevant to Thornton PS).

- **Payment Details** – Who is paying and what are you paying for

You must also enter details about who is paying. This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit / debit card details are captured in a secure manner. These details are not captured by Westpac or passed back to the school, therefore they must be entered each time you make an online payment. Under payment options, you enter the activity or item for which you are paying (ie. Zoo excursion). Write a title in the Payment Description that will enable the School Staff to match your payment with the school activity or item.

Please note - you can make several payments for a single student (ie. Dictionary & Camp.). Each student must be in a single transaction.

Example: Parent of Amy & Bill Bloggs wishes to make payments for both students. Parent must process Amy's payments, then press the **\$Make a Payment** button again to process Bill's payment.

- **Payment Options** – Enter the card details

Payments can be made using Mastercard & Visa Debit/Credit cards. You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Confirm your payment details. Enter the verification code (this simply ensures you are not a robot!).

- **Your Receipt** - Print or Save a Receipt

You can print your own receipts or have the receipt emailed to your email account. This gives you immediate proof that you have paid for the item.

- **Final Step** – Choose Make Another Payment or Close.

Make Another Payment is used to make payments for another student.

How does the school know I've paid?

- The next morning, details of the payments are passed to the school where they will be matched against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by us. If you wish, please contact the school the following day to confirm the payment has been received.

How long does it take for my payment to get to school?

- Any payment made before 6pm will be received the next business day by the school. Payments made after 6pm will be received 2 business days later.

Example: A payment made at 5.55pm on Thursday will be received by the school on Friday morning
A payment made at 6.05pm on Thursday will not be received until Monday morning.

Tuesday before 6pm	Wednesday morning
Wednesday before 6pm	Thursday morning
Thursday before 6pm	Friday morning
Friday before 6pm	Monday Morning
Saturday before 6pm	Tuesday Morning
Sunday before 6pm	Tuesday Morning
