

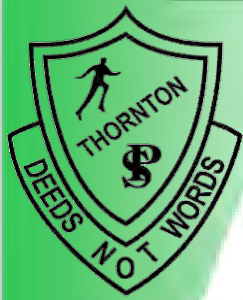

Axolotls differ from other salamanders in that they are permanently in water.</p>
<h2>Appearance</h2> <p>axolotls look like tadpoles with limbs. They have a pair of external gills. Axolotls can grow to around 10 cm as an adult. Axolotl colours are melanoid, white, albino, leucistic, black, and copper and grey which glow in the dark.</p>	<h2>Behaviour</h2> <p>Axolotls are gentle animals almost never come out of the water. Some of our Aboriginal students went on an excursion last week to celebrate Indigenous Literacy Day at the Sydney Opera House

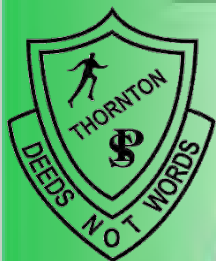

# Stage One Report

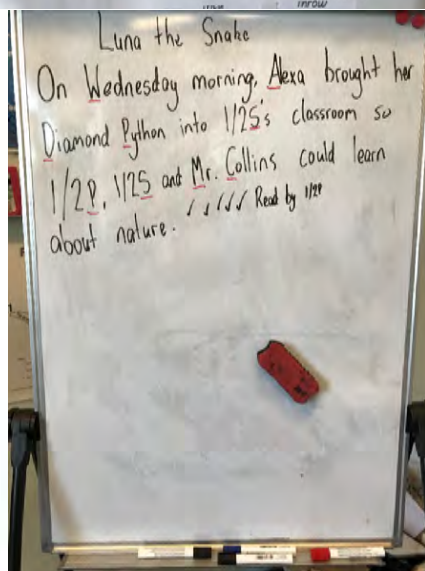

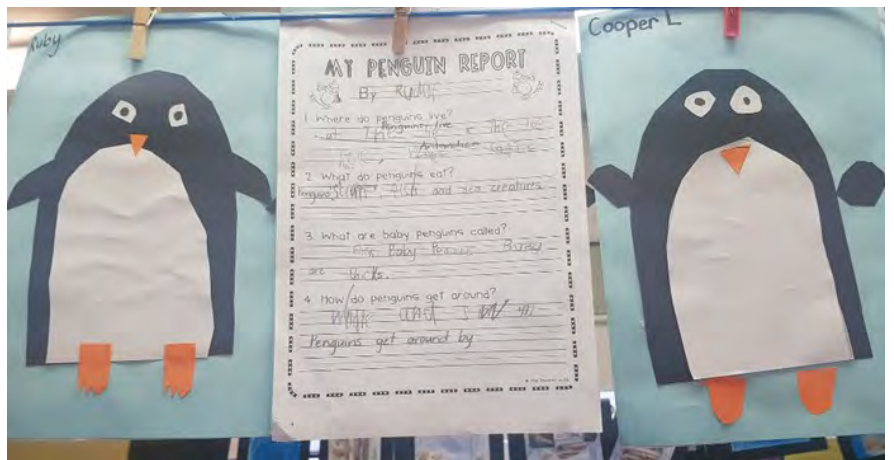
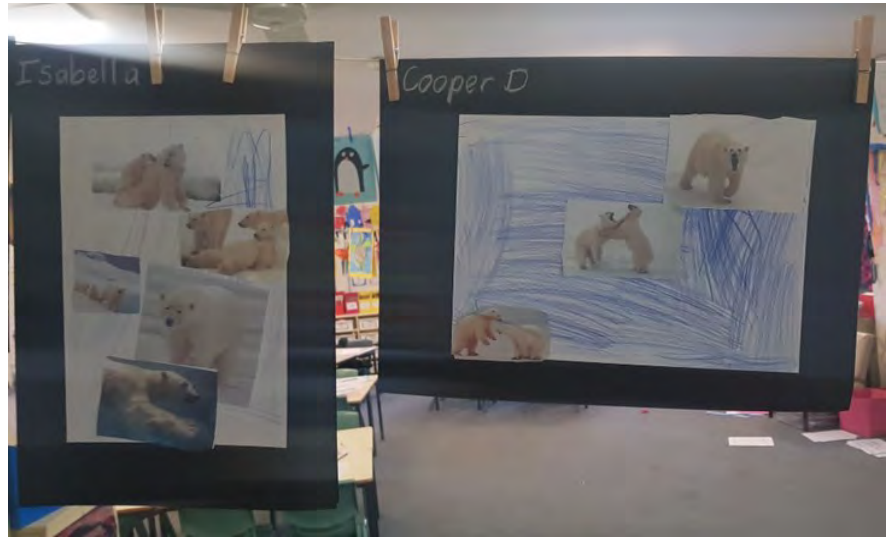
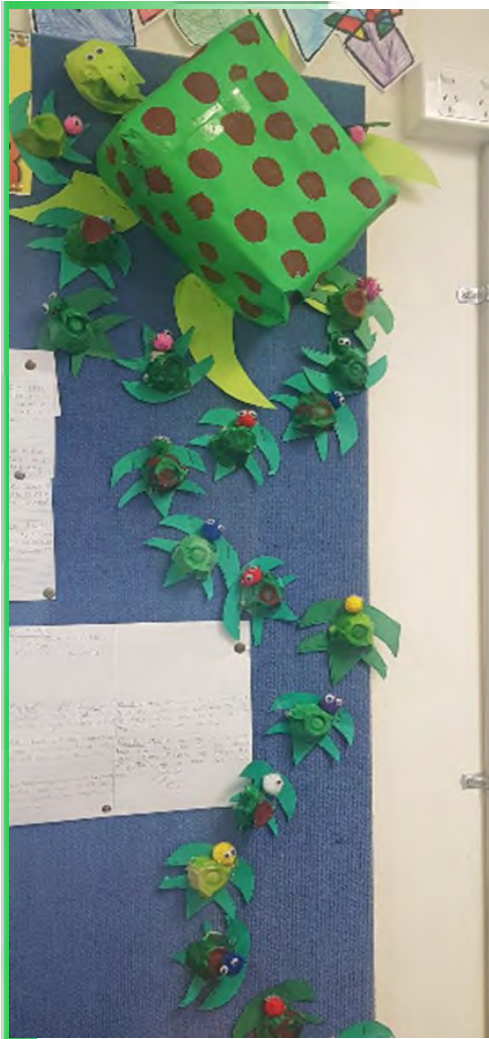


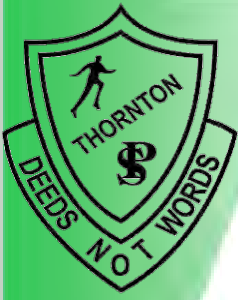
# 1/2T

- 5 training sessions totaling 10 hours of tuition.
- A minimum of 15 hours experience in an early years classroom completing set tasks.

## The simplest way


...to make cauliflower & spinach dahl.

**Ingredients**

1 tbsp olive oil	1/2 tsp paprika
1 tbsp mustard seeds	4 1/2 cups vegetable stock
1 red onion, diced	1 cup dried red lentils
3 cloves garlic, minced	1 can chickpeas, drained & rinsed
1 tbsp fresh ginger, grated	2 cups cauliflower florets
1 tbsp curry powder	2 cups baby spinach
1 tsp turmeric	1/2 cup fresh coriander
1/2 tsp ground coriander	Naan bread or steamed rice

**Method**

Heat a large saucepan over a medium heat and add the olive oil. When hot, add the mustard seeds and cook for one minute. Add the onion, garlic, ginger and sauté for 5 minutes. Add the curry powder, turmeric, ground coriander and paprika and sauté for a further minute.



Add the stock, lentils and chickpeas and stir to combine. Bring to a simmer and then cover and reduce heat to medium low. Cook for 20 minutes and then fold through the cauliflower. Cover again and cook for another 8 minutes. Add the spinach and fold through. Top with fresh coriander and serve with Naan bread or steamed rice.

## The simplest way

Test yourself with these SunSmart questions!

- 1: When do I need to use sun protection?
2. How can I be sun safe?
3. How can babies stay safe?



**Answers**

1. We need to use sun protection whenever the UV is three or above. In most of NSW, this is 11-12 months of the year. Check the SunSmart App every day to be sure.
2. It's simple, just *Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide!*
3. Children under 12 months should be kept out of direct sunlight. Sunscreen is not recommended for children under 6 months. Remember to carry out a sunscreen usage test.

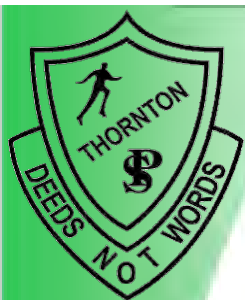

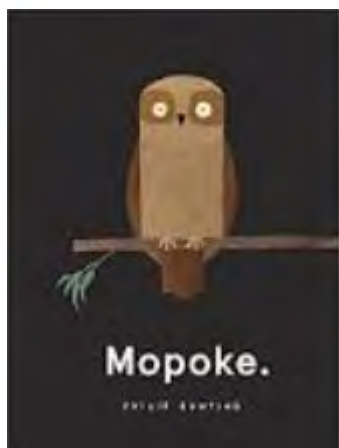
**Tadpoles visited the library on Friday.**

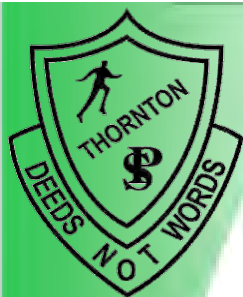
