### Principals Message

Dear Parent/caregiver,

Firstly my apologies for the lateness of this newsletter which should have gone out last week.

As you all know we lost a dear friend and colleague last week with the sad passing of Roz Hristopanos. This unfortunately led to a number of things being placed on the back burner as we supported our staff and students through this tragic and difficult time. Roz or Mrs H as the kids called her was a lovely lady, a local to Thornton and her children attended our great school. She loved working at TPS, loved being around the kids and her passing is a huge loss to our school and our support staff. She has worked with us since 2010 and I know she has had a huge impact on the lives of those students and families she supported during this time. I would like to thank those parents who have spoken to staff and offered their condolences and to those families who have sent gifts and also supplied lunch to the staff last week for your caring and thoughtful gestures.

There have been a small number of isolated cases of Chickenpox at our school in recent days. None of the students are currently attending as they are all self-isolating at home. If your child has any symptoms that you are concerned about, skin rash, fever, runny nose and generally unwell then please keep them at home until you have sought medical advice.

In Term 3, we are still under strict guidelines in relation to Covid-19 which is a good thing given the situation in Victoria. I have had concerns raised by parents in relation to some community members not following social distancing outside the school grounds. Although I have no authority to police social distancing outside of school grounds I would encourage all community members collecting students to adhere to the 1.5m rule and follow good hygiene practices.

The following guidelines may help parents understand what it is schools and the education Department have in place to ensure compliance and safety for all attending TPS.

Schools continue to be safe, and operations are in line with the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) and NSW Health advice. Under this advice, schools are not required to conduct widespread temperature screening or for anyone to wear masks.

All schools will be vigilant when implementing infection control, physical distancing and personal hygiene protocols to protect the health and safety of students and staff. Schools will promote the need to follow good hygiene practices like:

- regularly washing hands
- avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly.

The activities that are permitted at school will be conducted in a way that is safe and appropriate in the current environment. Those that remain on hold will be reviewed during the term and will recommence when appropriate based on health and other relevant advice.

### Physical distancing

Physical distancing of children in schools is not required under the AHPPC guidelines.

All adults must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m) including teachers and support staff, and parents.

Parents should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable them to physically distance from one another and from staff.

### School attendance

Remember not to send students to school if they are unwell, even if they have mild symptoms. Schools will make appropriate

arrangements to return students home if they come to school unwell or becomes unwell at school.

Students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe
- they are currently unwell.

### School activities/school site usage

The majority of school-based activities can recommence, as long as the following measures are observed:

- all visitors and external to school providers must adhere to relevant hygiene, distancing and safety protocols
- principals may continue to restrict, limit or prohibit activities if they are seen as contrary to the current health advice
- external providers and visitors are required to demonstrate compliance with health and safety requirements including adhering to strict guidelines and completing relevant forms
- non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events – this includes parents and carers unless specifically approved by the principal.

Enrolments 2020 - We are currently accepting kindergarten enrolments for 2021 and watching the Covid-19 restrictions in relation to when we are able to run Tadpoles. If you have a school-aged child who will start kindergarten next year please make contact with the office.
