This is our first newsletter for 2021 and we hope you will get lots of useful information out of this fortnightly communication.

We are two full weeks in to the school year and all students in Years K to 6 have been placed in their 2021 classes and are already working towards achieving growth in all Key Learning Areas. Our Kindergarten students have settled in to their school routine like seasoned professionals and they are all happily establishing new friendships and filling their days with learning and fun activities.

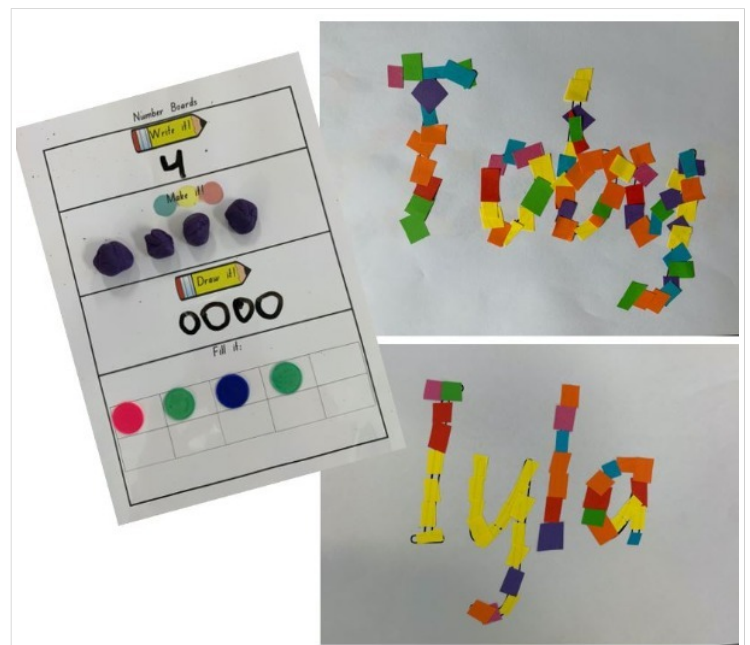

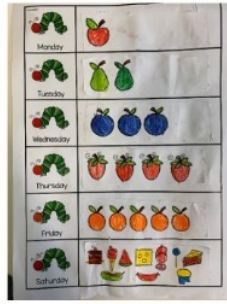

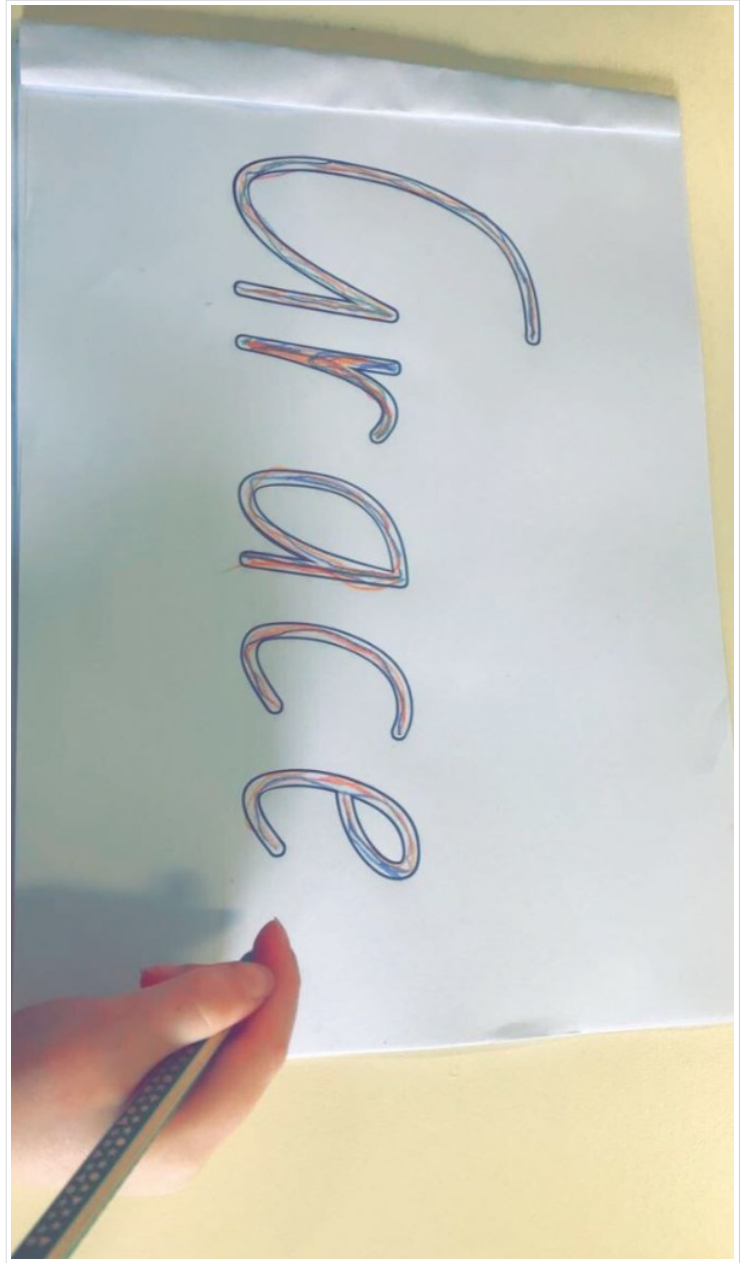


## KS

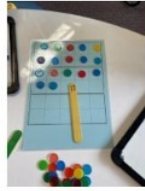

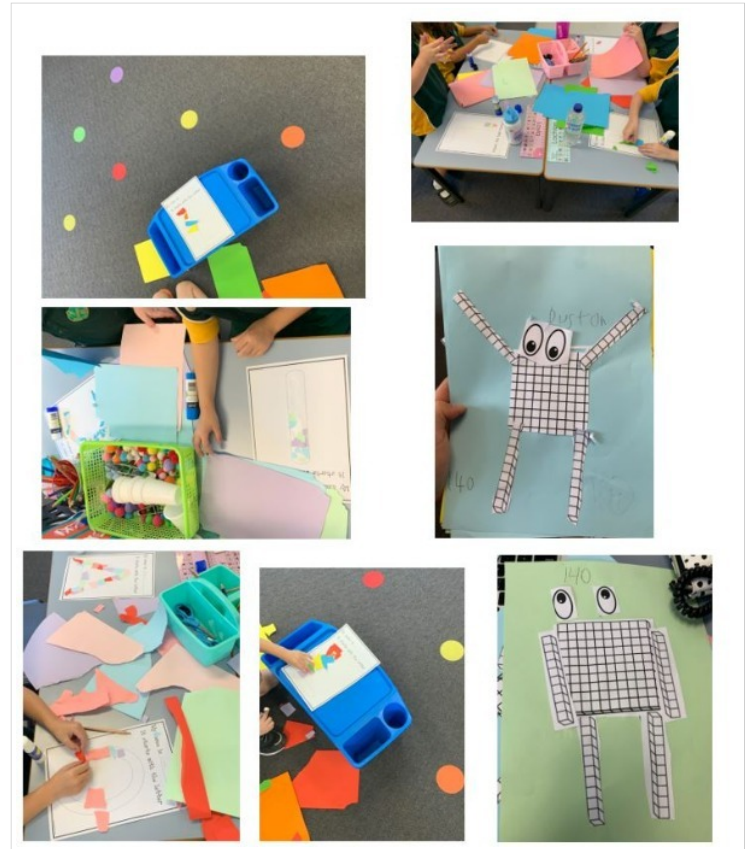
