

hat's one term done!

Preparations for NAPLAN 2021 are currently underway at TPS. This year, Year 3 and Year 5 will complete NAPLAN via the online platform. NAPLAN will take place in Week 4 of Term 2, and in the next few weeks, students and teachers will participate in practice sessions that will allow them to familiarise themselves with the online platform. If you have any questions regarding NAPLAN, please contact the school.

TPS will be holding a whole school Ride2School lap-a-thon on Wednesday 31st March. This lap-a-thon will be held on the school grounds of TPS and will allow students to ride a bike, scooter or walk designated laps of our playground. The lap-a-thon will start at 10am and will finish at 11am. This event will be for school students only. Students should decide whether they will be riding their bike, scooter or walking at the event, so they can organise to get bikes or scooters to school for the event on Wednesday. Students who don't have a scooter or bike will be able to walk a course. Helmets MUST be worn if a student is going to be riding a bike or scooter on the school grounds during the event. The Ride2School lap-a-thon will be a fundraiser event, raising money for our school gardening program. Students will need to bring a gold coin donation to participate. The students might even see us get out there and join in on the action!!

Please speak to your child about their safety before and after school. If your child is dropped off to school and walks in the gate, walks/rides/scoots/catches the bus to school by themselves, please ensure they understand that they need to go straight in to the school grounds for their own safety. Some students have been found to go to the skate park instead of going in to the school grounds. Please ensure your child knows if they have your permission to be at the skate park before or after school or if they need to come straight in to the school grounds. Supervision by Thornton Public School staff within the school grounds is from 8:30am until school begins at 9:00am.

Stage Two Report

It will be a busy and exciting end of the term for our Stage 2 students. Our Year 3 students have begun participating in School Readiness Testing for NAPLAN Online. These students will take part in practice tests to familiarise themselves with what NAPLAN Online will look like and ensure the school

network can meet the demands of the national assessment. Our Year 3 and 5 students will participate in the actual NAPLAN between 11 – 21 May 2021.

Our Stage 2 students will also participate in lessons using virtual reality kits that the school has borrowed as part of the Department of Education's 'stem.T4L' initiative. Students will have access to virtual reality headsets so they can participate in interactive virtual tours, literacy and numeracy activities. These activities will align with class teaching and learning programs.

Our students have also been participating in reading conferences with their classroom teachers and myself to further develop their reading skills. The conferencing process provides a unique opportunity for students to engage in reading where they can share their thoughts on what they have read, set goals for future reading and receive feedback from their teacher. Feedback from our students and teachers on this process has been overwhelmingly positive.

I wish our school community a safe and happy break over easter and look forward to the learning challenges ahead in Term 2.



In the Library

Throughout Term 1, all students across the school have engaged with quality learning in the library.

Kindergarten, have been learning about the rules of the library and have had the opportunity to borrow books from our extensive Junior Fiction section. They have also learnt what authors and illustrators are, and how to take care of our wonderful library books.

Years 1 and 2, have been learning about different types of transport and how to look for relevant information using both information texts and using credible websites like World Book Online. Some classes have discovered how planes stay in the sky and others have discussed how boats float. Such brilliant questions and discussions have been made.

Years 3 and 4, have been learning about our library platform ORBIT and how this can assist us to locate resources. During this process we learnt to use student orientated search engines and graphic organisers to summarise our information.




